Innovation Norway in Romania

In Romania, Innovation Norway is acting as Fund Operator for EEA and Norway Grants schemes which represent the contribution of Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway (the Donor countries) to reduce economic and social disparities and to strengthening bilateral relations with 15 EU countries in Central and Southern Europe. The Grant schemes support development projects in priority areas such as environment and climate change, business development, renewable energy, energy efficiency and energy security, health, childcare, social dialogue and civil society.


Under the current programme period 2014-2021, a total amount of Euro 502.5 mill. has been allocated to Romania, for financing of projects to be proposed by Romanian entities. Of the total allocation Innovation Norway has been appointed as Fund Operator for the following programs:

- "SMEs Growth Romania" with focus on Green Industry Innovation, Blue Growth and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). Total allocation: Euro 45,0 mill.
- "Renewable Energy, Energy Efficiency, Energy Security" with focus on Renewable Energy, Energy Efficiency, Research and Development, Electrification and Trainings/Awareness raising. Total allocation: Euro 62,8 mill.
- "Social Dialogue Decent Work". Total allocation: Euro 2,2 mill.

Main working areas for position
